I also got to play with Sadie and Lucy!


# Pioneer Square Portland, Oregon, USA





I also met the Archivist of the United States! His name is David Ferriero and he was very nice to take a picture with me. We're standing in front of a picture of President Franklin Roosevelt – he signed "An Act to Establish a National Archives of the United States" in 1934.
















For my last photo in my travel journal, I added a picture of me with another Stanley - a statue of the Radiator Springs founder in Cars Land.
